CONSTITUTIONAL QUESTION

"Shall the Constitution of the State be amended to permit the General Assembly to allow each voter to vote by absentee ballot?"

A YES vote on this amendment will give the General Assembly the ability to change the state constitution to allow all voters to vote by absentee ballot without providing an excuse, or reason. A NO vote means current regulations remain.

A NOTE ON ELECTORS

Each state has electors equal to its representation in Congress—two Senators plus the number of Representatives. Connecticut has seven electors in the Electoral College.

The Party of each of the candidates for President and Vice President chooses a slate of seven electors to represent their candidates. In Connecticut, all seven electoral votes are cast for the President and Vice Presidential slate that win the majority of the popular vote. It takes 270 electoral votes in the electoral college to win the presidency.
